

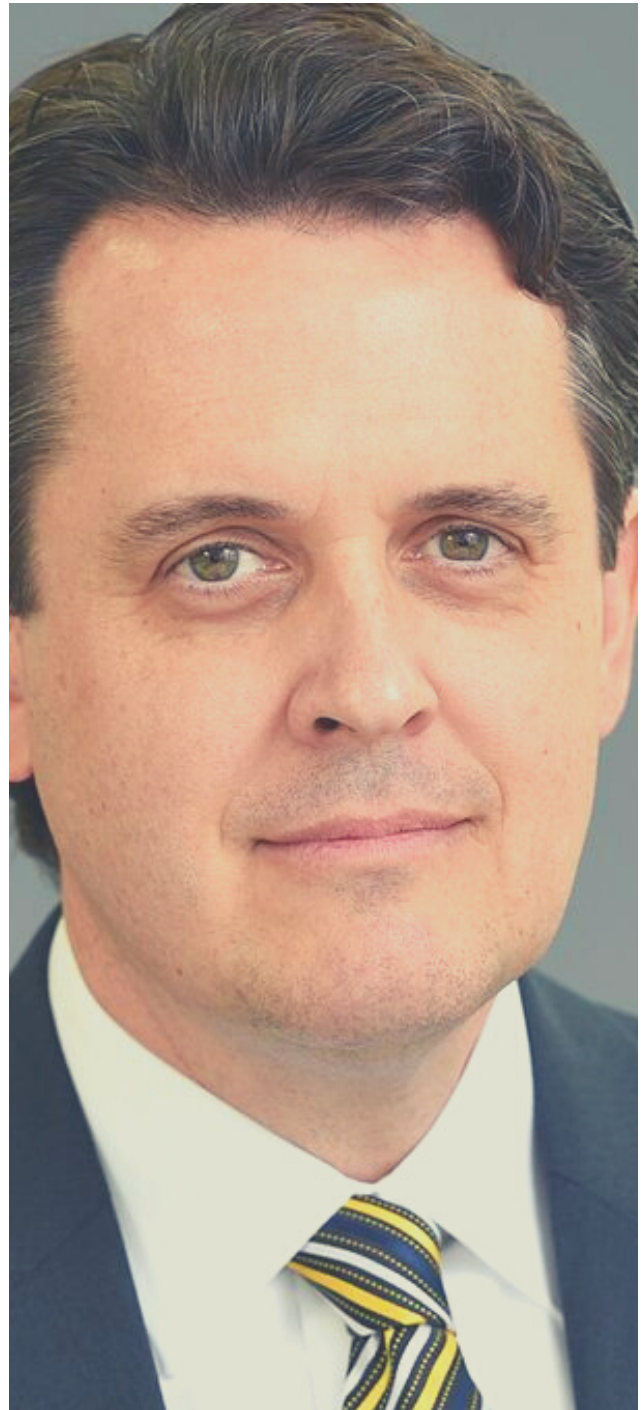
Dr. Brian Stiltner

Brian Stiltner is Professor of Philosophy, Theology, and Religious Studies at Sacred Heart University in Fairfield, Connecticut. He is co-chair of the university's Interprofessional Palliative Care Committee, and co-director of the university's Hersher Institute for Applied Ethics.

His teaching and research focuses on virtue ethics, Christian ethics, bioethics, religion and politics, and the ethics of war and peace.

He is the author of *Religion and the Common Good* (1999), *Faith and Force: A Christian Debate about War* (with David L. Clough, 2007), and *Toward Thriving Communities: Virtue Ethics as Social Ethics* (2016). His current research project, "Faith in Community" is an ethnographic study of suburban churches and their members' sense of community and civic engagement.

Raised in Columbus, Ohio, Stiltner received his undergraduate degree from John Carroll University in Cleveland, Ohio; his master's degree from Yale Divinity School; and his Ph.D. from Yale University.
